ORDER FOR NOTICE AND COMMENT

On February 10, 2016, MP2 Energy NE LLC ("MP2" or "Company"), filed an application with the State Corporation Commission ("Commission") for a license to conduct business as a competitive service provider of electricity ("Application"). In its Application, the Company seeks authority to serve eligible residential, commercial, industrial, and governmental electricity customers throughout the Commonwealth of Virginia.¹ MP2 attests that it will abide by all applicable regulations of the Commission as required by 20 VAC 5-312-40 B of the Commission's Rules Governing Retail Access to Competitive Energy Services.

In conjunction with the filing of its Application, the Company filed a Motion for Protective Order and a proposed protective order that establishes procedures governing the use of confidential information in this proceeding.

NOW THE COMMISSION, upon consideration of the Application, is of the opinion and finds that it should docket MP2's Application; that MP2 should serve this Order upon appropriate persons; that the Commission's Staff ("Staff") should conduct an investigation of the Application and present its findings in a report ("Staff Report"); and that interested persons should have an

¹ Although MP2 seeks to serve customers throughout the Commonwealth of Virginia, retail choice exists only in the service territories of Dominion Virginia Power, Appalachian Power Company, and the electric cooperatives. Moreover, retail choice for electricity is only permitted pursuant to the customer classes, load parameters, and renewable energy sources as set forth in the Code of Virginia.

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opportunity to comment on the Application. Regarding the Company's Motion for Protective Order, the Commission will defer determining the necessity of a protective order herein until a request is made for such confidential information.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

(1) This matter is docketed and assigned Case No. PUE-2016-00014.

(2) A copy of the Application and supporting documents shall be made available for public inspection in the Commission's Document Control Center, located on the first floor of the Tyler Building, 1300 East Main Street, Richmond, Virginia 23219, between the hours of 8:15 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, excluding holidays. A copy of the Application also may be downloaded from the Commission's website: <http://www.scc.virginia.gov/case>.

(3) On or before February 25, 2016, MP2 shall serve a copy of this Order upon each utility listed on Attachment A to this Order.

(4) On or before March 3, 2016, the Company shall file proof of service as ordered herein with Joel H. Peck, Clerk, State Corporation Commission, c/o Document Control Center, P.O. Box 2118, Richmond, Virginia 23218-2118.

(5) Any interested person may request a copy of the Application, accompanying materials, and this Order by directing a request in writing to Brian R. Greene, Esquire, GreeneHurlocker, 1807 Libbie Avenue, Suite 102, Richmond, Virginia 23226. The Company shall, within three (3) days of receipt of such request, serve the requested documents upon the person making such request.

(6) Written comments on the Application may be filed on or before March 10, 2016, by either of the following methods. An original and fifteen (15) copies of any comments may be filed with the Clerk of the Commission at the address set forth in Ordering Paragraph (4). In the

alternative, comments may be submitted electronically by following the instructions available at the Commission's website: <http://www.scc.virginia.gov/case>. A hard copy of such comments, whether submitted in writing or electronically, shall be served upon the Company at the address set forth in Ordering Paragraph (5). All comments shall refer to Case No. PUE-2016-00014.

(7) The Commission Staff shall analyze MP2's Application and shall present its findings in a Staff Report to be filed on or before March 15, 2016.

(8) On or before March 21, 2016, the Company and any party who filed comments on the Application may file with the Clerk of the Commission an original and fifteen (15) copies of any response to the Staff Report.

(9) The Company shall respond to written interrogatories or data requests within five (5) calendar days after the receipt of the same. Interrogatories and data requests, as well as the responses thereto, shall be transmitted via facsimile or electronic mail as well as by first class mail. Except as modified herein, discovery shall be in accordance with Part IV of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 5 VAC 5-20-10 *et seq.*

(10) This matter is continued generally.
