For permission to aggregate or combine demands of two or more individual nonresidential retail customers of electric energy pursuant to § 56-577 A 4 of the Code of Virginia

ORDER FOR NOTICE AND COMMENT

On August 28, 2017, Wawa, Inc. ("Wawa"), made a filing ("Petition") with the State Corporation Commission ("Commission") a Petition seeking permission to aggregate or combine the demands of certain nonresidential customers of electric energy pursuant to § 56-577 A 4 of the Code of Virginia ("Code").

Under Code § 56-577 A 3, retail access to competitive electricity supply is available to certain large customers with demand exceeding five megawatts. For the purpose of meeting the demand limitations of Code § 56-577 A 3, certain customers may petition for Commission approval to aggregate or combine their demands.¹ Code § 56-577 A 4 provides, among other things, that the Commission may approve such a petition if it finds that:

- (a) Neither such customers' incumbent electric utility nor retail customers of such utility that do not choose to obtain electric energy from alternate suppliers will be adversely affected in a manner contrary to the public interest by granting such petition. In making such determination, the Commission shall take into consideration, without limitation, the impact and effect of any and

all other previously approved petitions of like type with respect to such incumbent electric utility; and

(b) Approval of such petition is consistent with the public interest.

Wawa identifies itself as the parent of 82 individual convenience stores in Virginia for which Wawa seeks Commission permission to aggregate or combine demands.² The Petition also identifies Virginia Electric and Power Company as the local distribution company that is certificated to provide retail electric service in the area where Wawa proposes to aggregate load up to the five megawatt statutory threshold.³

NOW THE COMMISSION, upon consideration of Wawa's Petition, is of the opinion and finds that the Petition should be docketed; that this Order for Notice and Comment should be served upon appropriate persons; that the Commission's Staff ("Staff") should conduct an investigation of the Petition and present its findings in a report; and that interested persons should have an opportunity to comment and request a hearing on the Petition.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

(1) This matter is docketed and assigned Case No. PUR-2017-00113.

(2) A copy of the Petition and supporting documents shall be made available for public inspection in the Commission's Document Control Center, located on the first floor of the Tyler Building, 1300 East Main Street, Richmond, Virginia, between the hours of 8:15 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday through Friday, excluding holidays. A copy of the Petition also may be downloaded from the Commission's website: <http://www.scc.virginia.gov/case>.

(3) On or before September 29, 2017, Wawa shall serve a copy of this Order for Notice and Comment upon Virginia Electric and Power Company by delivering a copy to William H. Baxter, II, Deputy General Counsel, Dominion Energy Virginia, P.O. Box 26532, Richmond, Virginia 23261.

(4) On or before October 6, 2017, Wawa shall file proof of service as ordered herein with Joel H. Peck, Clerk, State Corporation Commission, c/o Document Control Center, P.O. Box 2118, Richmond, Virginia, 23218-2118.

(5) Any interested person may request a copy of the Petition, accompanying materials, and this Order for Notice and Comment by directing a request in writing to: Meade A. Spotts, Esquire, Spotts Fain, Post Office Box 1555, Richmond, Virginia 23218-1555. Wawa shall, within three (3) days of receiving such request, serve the requested documents upon the person making such request.

(6) Written comments on the Petition may be filed on or before October 31, 2017, by either of the following methods. An original and fifteen (15) copies of any comments may be filed with the Clerk of the Commission at the address set forth in Ordering Paragraph (4) above. In the alternative, comments may be submitted electronically by following the instructions available at the Commission's website: <http://www.scc.virginia.gov/case>. A hard copy of such comments, whether submitted in writing or electronically, shall be served on counsel for Wawa at the address set forth in Ordering Paragraph (5). All comments shall refer to Case No. PUR-2017-00113.

(7) On or before October 31, 2017, any interested person may request that the Commission convene a hearing on the Petition. If not filed electronically, an original and fifteen (15) copies of the request for hearing shall be filed with the Clerk of the Commission at the

address set forth in Ordering Paragraph (4). Requests for hearing shall refer to Case No. PUR-2017-00113 and shall include: (i) a precise statement of the filing party's interest in the proceeding; (ii) a statement of the specific action sought to the extent then known; (iii) a statement of the legal basis for such action; and (iv) a precise statement why a hearing should be conducted in this matter. A copy also shall be served on counsel for Wawa at the address set forth in Ordering Paragraph (5).

(8) The Staff shall analyze Wawa's Petition and shall present its findings in a report to be filed on or before December 1, 2017.

(9) On or before December 15, 2017, Wawa and any person who filed comments on the Petition may file with the Clerk of the Commission any response to the Staff report and any other comments submitted in response to the Petition. If not filed electronically, an original and fifteen (15) copies of the response shall be submitted to the Clerk of the Commission at the address in Ordering Paragraph (4).

(10) Wawa shall respond to written interrogatories or data requests within seven (7) calendar days after the receipt of the same. Interrogatories and data requests, as well as the responses thereto, shall be transmitted via facsimile or electronic mail as well as by first class mail. Except as modified herein, discovery shall be in accordance with Part IV of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure, 5 VAC 5-20-10 *et seq.*

(11) This matter is continued.
