ORDER FOR NOTICE AND HEARING

On October 3, 2018, Virginia Electric and Power Company d/b/a Dominion Energy Virginia ("Dominion" or "Company"), pursuant to § 56-585.1 A 6 of the Code of Virginia ("Code") and the Commission's Final Order in Case No. PUR-2017-00128,¹ filed with the State Corporation Commission ("Commission") an annual update with respect to the Company's rate adjustment clause, Rider BW ("Application"). Through its Application, the Company seeks to recover costs associated with the Brunswick County Power Station, a 1,358 megawatt (nominal) natural gas-fired combined-cycle electric generating facility, as well as the related transmission interconnection facilities, in Brunswick County, Virginia ("Project").²

In Case No. PUE-2012-00128,³ the Commission approved construction of the Project. In conjunction therewith, the Commission also approved a rate adjustment clause, designated

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Rider BW, which allowed Dominion to recover costs associated with the development of the Project.⁴ The Company has since annually updated its Rider BW rate adjustment clause.⁵

In this proceeding, Dominion has asked the Commission to approve Rider BW for the rate year beginning September 1, 2019, and ending August 31, 2020 ("2019 Rate Year").⁶ The two key components of the proposed total revenue requirement for the 2019 Rate Year are the Projected Cost Recovery Factor and the Actual Cost True-Up Factor.⁷ The Company is requesting a Projected Cost Recovery Factor revenue requirement of \$107,184,000, and an Actual Cost True-Up Factor revenue requirement of \$16,015,000.⁸ Thus, the Company is requesting a total revenue requirement of \$123,199,000 for service rendered during the 2019 Rate Year.⁹ Dominion requests a rate effective date for usage on and after the latter of September 1, 2019, or the first day of the month that is at least 15 days following the date of any Commission order approving Rider BW.¹⁰

For purposes of calculating the Projected Cost Recovery Factor in this case, Dominion proposes an enhanced rate of return on common equity ("ROE") of 10.2%, which it states is supported by the Commission's Final Order in Case No. PUR-2017-00038.¹¹ This includes a

base ROE of 9.2%, plus a 100 basis points enhanced return, as provided for in Code § 56-585.1 A 6 for a combined cycle generating station at the time the Project was approved, and as authorized by the Commission's CPCN Order for the Project.¹² For purposes of calculating the Actual Cost True-Up Factor, the Company used an enhanced ROE of 10.6% for the months of January 2017 through August 2017, which comprises a 9.6% ROE approved by the Commission in its Final Order in Case No. PUE-2015-00102,¹³ plus the 100 basis points ROE adder.¹⁴ The Company used an enhanced ROE of 10.4% for the period of September 2017 through November 28, 2017, which comprises a 9.4% ROE approved by the Commission in its Order in Case No. PUE-2016-00112,¹⁵ plus the 100 basis points ROE adder.¹⁶ Dominion states that it used an enhanced ROE of 10.2% for the period of November 29, 2017, through December 31, 2017, which, as noted above, is comprised of the 9.2% ROE that was approved in the 2017 ROE Order, plus the 100 basis points adder.¹⁷

If the proposed Rider BW for the 2019 Rate Year is approved, the impact on customer bills would depend on the customer's rate schedule and usage. According to Dominion,

implementation of its proposed Rider BW on September 1, 2019, would increase the monthly bill of a residential customer using 1,000 kilowatt hours per month by approximately \$0.23.¹⁸

The Company proposes a change in the methodology for the calculation of a certain allocation factor beginning in 2018 to recognize the output of certain non-utility generators to be used to allocate cost responsibility to the Virginia jurisdiction.¹⁹ In addition, with the exception of the removal of certain federal and retail choice customers from the Virginia jurisdiction, the Company indicates it has calculated the proposed Rider BW rates in accordance with the same methodology as used for rates approved by the Commission in the most recent Rider BW proceeding, Case No. PUR-2017-00128.²⁰

Dominion also requests a waiver of Rules 20 VAC 5-201-60 ("Rule 60") and 20 VAC 5-201-90 ("Rule 90") of the Rules Governing Utility Rate Applications and Annual Informational Filings ("Rate Case Rules") with respect to Schedule 45 and Schedule 46 (in part). Rule 60 of the Rate Case Rules requires that an application filed pursuant to Code § 56-585.1 A 6 include Schedule 45, "Return on Equity Peer Group Benchmark," with the utility's direct testimony. Rule 90 of the Rate Case Rules states that Schedule 45 must include "documentation supporting the return on equity benchmark proposed pursuant to § 56-585.1 A 2 a and b of the Code" In support of its request for waiver of Schedule 45, Dominion states that the Commission approved a 9.2% ROE in its 2017 ROE Order to be

applied to Dominion's Subsection A 5 and A 6 rate adjustment clauses, including Rider BW.²¹ Dominion indicates that, in this proceeding, it is requesting that an ROE of 9.2% be used to calculate the Projected Cost Recovery Factor revenue requirement for Rider BW. Accordingly, the Company asserts that waiver of this schedule in this proceeding is warranted by judicial economy and efficiency of case administration.²²

Finally, in conjunction with the filing of its Application on October 3, 2018, the Company filed the Motion of Virginia Electric and Power Company for Entry of a Protective Ruling ("Motion for Protective Ruling") and a proposed protective ruling that establishes procedures governing the use of confidential information in this proceeding.

NOW THE COMMISSION, upon consideration of this matter, is of the opinion and finds that this matter should be docketed; Dominion should provide public notice of its Application; a public hearing should be scheduled for the purpose of receiving testimony and evidence on the Application; interested persons should have an opportunity to file comments on the Application or participate as a respondent in this proceeding; and the Commission's Staff ("Staff") should be directed to investigate the Application and file testimony and exhibits containing its findings and recommendations thereon.

We also find that a Hearing Examiner should be assigned to conduct all further proceedings in this matter on behalf of the Commission, including ruling on the Company's Motion for Protective Ruling and filing a final report containing the Hearing Examiner's findings and recommendations.

Finally, we grant Dominion's request to waive the filing of Schedule 45 and Schedule 46 (in part) for purposes of making the Application complete and commencing this proceeding.

Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

(1) This matter is docketed and assigned Case No. PUR-2018-00166.

(2) As provided by Code § 12.1-31 and 5 VAC 5-20-120, *Procedure before Hearing Examiners*, of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure ("Rules of Practice"),²³ a Hearing Examiner is appointed to conduct all further proceedings in this matter on behalf of the Commission.

(3) A public hearing on the Application shall be convened on March 26, 2019, at 10 a.m., in the Commission's second floor courtroom located in the Tyler Building, 1300 East Main Street, Richmond, Virginia 23219, to receive the testimony of public witnesses and the evidence of the Company, any respondents, and the Staff. Any person desiring to offer testimony as a public witness at this hearing should appear in the Commission's courtroom fifteen (15) minutes prior to the starting time of the hearing and contact the Commission's Bailiff.

(4) The Company shall make copies of the public version of its Application, as well as a copy of this Order for Notice and Hearing, available for public inspection during regular business hours at each of the Company's business offices in the Commonwealth of Virginia. Copies also may be obtained by submitting a written request to counsel for the Company, Lisa S. Booth, Esquire, Dominion Energy Services, Inc., 120 Tredegar Street, Richmond, Virginia 23219. If acceptable to the requesting party, the Company may provide the documents by electronic means. Copies of the public version of all documents also shall be available for

forth: (i) a precise statement of the interest of the respondent; (ii) a statement of the specific action sought to the extent then known; and (iii) the factual and legal basis for the action. Any organization, corporation, or government body participating as a respondent must be represented by counsel as required by 5 VAC 5-20-30, *Counsel*, of the Rules of Practice. All filings shall refer to Case No. PUR-2018-00166.

(10) Within five (5) business days of receipt of a notice of participation as a respondent, the Company shall serve upon each respondent a copy of this Order for Notice and Hearing, a copy of the public version of the Application, and a copy of the public version of all materials filed by the Company with the Commission, unless these materials already have been provided to the respondent.

(11) On or before January 29, 2019, each respondent may file with the Clerk of the Commission at the address set forth in Ordering Paragraph (7) and serve on the Staff, the Company, and all other respondents, any testimony and exhibits by which the respondent expects to establish its case, and each witness's testimony shall include a summary not to exceed one page. (16) The Company's request for waiver of the requirements of 20 VAC 5-201-60 and 20 VAC 5-201-90 for filing Schedule 45 and Schedule 46 (in part) is granted, as set forth in this Order.

(17) This matter is continued.
